RTN Federal Credit Union Awards \$10,000 in Scholarships

Waltham, MA—RTN Federal Credit Union has announced the 2014 recipients of its James A. Burley, Jr. Scholarship Award. The monetary prizes totaling \$10,000 are conferred annually to three college-bound students whose parents are Credit Union Members.

Jonathan Skaza of Franklin received the top prize of \$5,000; he is attending Bryant University. Sarah Woods of Medford earned \$3,000 as the second-prize recipient; she is attending Boston College. Joseph Dwyer of Waltham took home a third-place prize of \$2,000; he is attending the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.

The annual award is named in honor of RTN's late Chairman and Director, James A. Burley, Jr., who served the Credit Union for more than 30 years. Scholarship recipients are selected based on their written responses to a thematic-based essay. This year's question was, "What is your brand?" RTN received more than 100 applications.

"The Burley Scholarship reflects our investment in the next generation of credit union members," said Richard Wright, RTN Treasurer and CEO. "RTN is proud to play a role in helping to make the goal of higher education a bit more financially accessible for our member families."

Community involvement is a core value of RTN Federal Credit Union, a full-service financial cooperative providing members with high-quality financial products and personal service. Founded in 1945, RTN is one of the largest credit unions in Massachusetts, with \$800 million in assets, 50,000 members and 19 branches.
